First Generation

1. **James Henry "Jim" WADDELL** was born on 8 Sep 1928 in Toronto, York, Ontario, Canada. He was christened on 25 Nov 1928 in Toronto, Ontario, Canada. Jim married Isabell Margaret CAMPBELL on 24 May 1952 in Toronto, Ontario, Canada.

Jim was employed by Ontario Hydro, (then the Provincial Electric Power Authority), for over 40 years where he worked in a variety of customer service, sales and marketing positions before retiring in 1988 as a Marketing Training Officer. In 1985, he was president of the employee's Quarter Century Club in the club's 50th year. In his younger days he served 4 years in the Canadian Militia (Signal Corps) attaining the rank of sergeant. He was also a member of the Masonic Order where he became a Master Mason. Until moving to Brampton, Jim was a volunteer for several years in the Intensive Care Unit of the Queensway General Hospital near his home in Etobicoke. In Brampton, he did volunteer work for Peel Hospice for a while and later completed a 3-year term on the Board of Directors for the Condo building where he presently resides. He enjoys his computer and email contacts as he searches the 'net' while working on his family genealogy research projects.

As health problems began to develop for both Jim and his wife Isabell, home maintenance became increasingly difficult. The logical alternative was the sale in 1995, of the long-time home in Etobicoke and then a move to a Condominium apartment in Brampton to be near their three married daughters. Unfortunately, Isabell died from the effects of pancreatic and breast cancer just a few short months after they moved in. In 1996 he met Florence, a widow, who was also a resident in the building. They were married 23 August 1997, by a "J.P." Frank Russell, in a private ceremony held in the party room of the building in the presence of all members of both families, including their combined 11 grandchildren.

FOOTNOTE: Computer assembly of these family files started in July of 1992 when Jim found he couldn't answer a question from one of his daughters as to the names of her great-grandparents. The search for family members has been an on-going hobby and project ever since.

2. **Isabell Margaret CAMPBELL** was born on 15 Sep 1930 in East York Twp, York, Ontario, Canada. She was christened on 15 Feb 1932 in Toronto, Ontario, Canada. She died on 14 Dec 1995 in Mississauga, Ontario, Canada. She was buried in (cremation) in Brampton, Ontario.

Isabell's name was intended to be "Isabella" (after her mother), but somehow the letter "A" never made it to her birth certificate. She was happiest when knitting -- a skill she learned from her mother. She turned out a prodigious amount of knitted baby wear and other items for all her children as well as gifts for others. Prior to becoming a full-time homemaker, she was employed as a legal secretary. Isabell became and remained a Girl Guide Leader until after her youngest daughter had started in Guiding. Today she would be pleased to learn that all her granddaughters have also been active in the Girl-Guide movement. Isabell loved to play cards and board games with her daughters and grandchildren and did so with an enjoyment and intensity level that was hard to believe. (Possibly one major character flaw was that she found it extremely difficult to pass a Bingo Parlour). Developing health problems forced the sale of the long-time home in Etobicoke and a move to a condominium apartment in Brampton in May of 1995. She didn't have long to enjoy it, as just a few months later in December, Isabell died in the Credit Valley Hospital, Mississauga, Ontario, after a lengthy 3-year battle with pancreatic and breast cancer.

BURIAL: Cremation took place at Meadowvale Crematorium, Mississauga, Ontario, 15 Dec 1995. A Memorial Service was held in Brampton, Ontario, 18 Dec 1995 and her cremation ashes were later scattered at the family cottage at Miller Lake, Ontario, during a short family service held the following spring.

They had the following children.

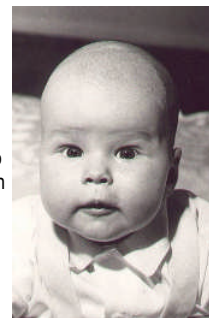
- F i. **Barbara Elaine WADDELL** was born on 28 Jul 1956 in Toronto, York, Ontario, Canada. She was christened on 18 Nov 1956 in Alderwood U Ch, Etobicoke, Ontario, Canada.

Barb, (never call her Barbara), followed her mother as a leader in the Girl Guide movement until marriage and family commitments intervened. With a friend she operated a home-craft business for a while but has since given that up. She is currently employed in a clerical function with Ontario Power Generating, (one of the successor companies of the former Ontario Hydro.) Barb also has a talent for cake decorating and usually finds herself called upon to provide one of her 'specials' whenever the family holds a birthday or anniversary gathering.

- M ii. **Russell James WADDELL** was born on 10 Apr 1958 in Etobicoke Twp, York, Ontario, Canada. He was christened on 2 Nov 1958 in Clarkson U Ch, Clarkson, Ontario, Canada. He died on 26 May 1965 in Orillia, Ontario, Canada. He was buried on 28 May 1965 in Orillia, Ontario, Canada

Russell was unfortunately born mentally handicapped and also suffered from epileptic seizures. His condition worsened to the point that it became necessary for him to have round-the-clock care in a Children's Hospital in Orillia. Just after his 7th birthday, he died in hospital when he failed to recover from a seizure.

However, part of Russell lives on. It was arranged to have his corneas transplanted. We subsequently learned that one cornea went to a blind typist, (who later wrote us a letter), and the other went to a carpenter who had lost his sight in an industrial accident.



- F iii. **Judy Lynn WADDELL** was born on 1 May 1960 in Etobicoke Twp, York, Ontario, Canada. She was christened on 26 Jun 1960 in Alderwood U Ch, Etobicoke, Ontario, Canada.

In the family tradition, Judy also became a leader in the Girl Guide movement until marriage and family commitments intervened. Later, when her own daughters were of an age to join, she went back as a leader for several years. Judy worked as a secretary in the former Research Division of Ontario Hydro for many years, which was where she met her future husband John. She retired to become a full time homemaker, but now that her children are older, she is back in the work force as a School Secretary for the Peel Board of Education in Brampton where the family currently resides. Judy and family have also taken on the chore of fostering dogs for the "Seeing Eye" program and at this writing (2007) are now working with their 9th dog. (While not all of their dogs have 'graduated', it has been gratifying for them to see some successful placements).



- F iv. **Arlene Louise WADDELL** was born on 31 Mar 1963 in Etobicoke Twp, York, Ontario, Canada. She was christened on 1 Dec 1963 in Alderwood U Ch, Etobicoke, Ontario, Canada.

The last of our children, Arlene was born with an 'RH negative blood factor' which, at that time required an immediate blood transfusion even though she was only a few hours old. As her father, I had the traumatic experience of transferring her in a mobile incubator, (in my own car accompanied by a nurse), from the Queensway General hospital in Etobicoke where she was born, to Toronto's Sick Children's Hospital where the blood transfusion was performed.

As a teenager, Arlene achieved the "Canada Cord", (then the highest award attainable in the Girl Guide Movement). She made the "Dean's List" and graduated with Honours from Ryerson University in Toronto with a Bachelor of Business Management Degree. Arlene enjoys singing and her choir activities and at this writing is the longest serving member of her church choir. She has been called upon as a soloist at weddings (including those of both her sisters.) Arlene and her future husband Graham first met in their teenage years, when as part of their respective Guide and Scout troops, they both happened to be working on the same renovation project at a district summer camp. It turned out they were both assigned to paint the same washroom – and it's been true love ever since! (It's also interesting to note that Graham now does all the painting). Arlene is currently a Contract administrator in Ontario Power Generation - Nuclear, one of the successor companies of the former Ontario Hydro.



Second Generation

4. **James "Scotty" WADDELL** was born on 6 Sep 1886 in Bannockburn, Stirlingshire, Scotland. He died on 22 Feb 1969 in East Gen Hosp, East York, Ontario, Canada. He was buried on 25 Feb 1969 in Mt Pleasant Cem, Toronto, Ontario, Canada. Scotty married Marjorie Louise HARDING on 21 Dec 1921 in Toronto, Ontario, Canada.

He is found on the 1901 census at "Little Camoquhill" with his parents and 6 sister siblings then still at home. (His three older brothers had already left). My father first came to Canada about 1905 and after two return trips to Scotland, he immigrated to stay in 1909 and traveled around the prairies doing farm work. He is picked up on the 1911 census on a farm near Regina. It is believed that it was around this time when he first met my mother. She had been visiting her sister Clara and her husband Bob Fogal on their farm near Lafleche when dad came calling looking for work. It's not known how long he stayed, but obviously he kept in touch with my mother. It is known they met again in the Montreal area where Mom worked for a while before dad went west again. Eventually they wound up in Toronto, married and settled to stay. Dad once told me about his experiences on one of his trips home. After saying hello to his mother, he went to the barn where his father was harnessing a horse. When he called out a greeting, the strange voice startled the horse that then kicked out and broke his father's leg. Dad's homecoming was then extended until his father could manage on his own.



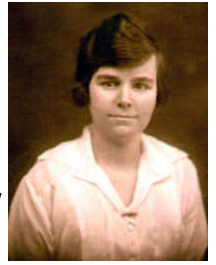
Once settled in Toronto, he worked first as a teamster for Hendrie cartage, then the freight agent for CN Railways. Although the use of trucks was increasing, horses were still a major form of transport before WWII. The Toronto harbour would often freeze hard in the winter and Dad sometimes drove a team and sleigh with supplies across the ice to the Toronto Islands where a sizable number of people then lived year-round. We lived in a company flat at #5 Peter Street next door to his work location, on the north-east corner of Peter and Front streets across from where the Rogers Sky-Dome is today. As part of his rental arrangement for the company flat, Dad was required to help feed and water the horses on weekends. However, after a work related injury in 1936, (his first broken leg), he was let go. (These were the "depression" pre-war years and there were no unions in those days to protect the workers' interests).

Dad later became a shipper-receiver for a trucking company specializing in moving machinery and other heavy equipment. It was hard physical work and once again, employment injuries took their toll. He suffered several serious accidents including having both legs broken, one for the second time. These injuries later developed into severe arthritis leaving him virtually immobile in his later years. His first leg operation had been "botched" and later required another operation that in turn, left him with a permanent limp. The Employment Compensation Board awarded him a generous (?) "Life-time" pension of \$5.00 a month. But he was a tough old bird and when he lived longer than they expected, the Board "signed him off" with a lump sum payment of \$250.00 on his 75th birthday. He had taught himself to play the "squeeze box", a small accordion he had brought with him from Scotland. It was certainly a life-time of enjoyment for him over the miles and years. As the fabric dried out and the seams split, he patched it with tape to keep it going much to the delight of his granddaughter Barbara who always pressured him to play it for her.

One evening in his sleep, he lapsed into a coma from which he never regained consciousness. Moved to a hospital, he died there peacefully about a week later. He is buried with his wife in Mount Pleasant Cemetery, Section 54, Grave #1988.

5. **Marjorie Louise HARDING** was born on 23 Aug 1892 in Adamsville, Brome Cty, Quebec, Canada. She was christened on 25 Jun 1893 in Anglican Ch., Adamsville. She died on 18 Jul 1973 in North York, Ontario, Canada. She was buried on 19 Jul 1973 in Mt Pleasant Cem, Toronto, Ontario, Canada.

My Harding grandparents immigrated from England in 1892, landing in Montreal from Liverpool and then settled in Adamsville, Quebec. (My grandmother was pregnant during the voyage over, which was probably not a very pleasant experience in those days and my mother was born shortly after they arrived). I don't have a lot of details about my mother's early life in Quebec other than she was raised on a farm. I recall her once telling me that during WWI, she had a job in a munitions plant in Montreal that made artillery shells. (She said she often wondered if they worked). She married my father in Toronto where they settled and lived the rest of their days. Sometime after my father's death, my mother developed severe arthritis in both her hands to the extent that they became virtually useless. She became unable to care for herself and was admitted to a nursing home. While there, she slipped and fell breaking her hip. She never fully recovered from this set back and died soon afterwards in the nursing home. She is buried with her husband in Mount Pleasant Cemetery, Toronto, Section 54, Grave #1988.



They had the following children.

- + 2 M i. **James Henry "Jim" WADDELL** was born on 8 Sep 1928.

6. **Robert Blythe "Bob" CAMPBELL** was born on 2 Apr 1896 in Tighnabruaich, Argyll, Scotland. He died on 4 Jan 1967 in Oak-Traf Hosp, Oakville, Ontario, Canada. He was buried on 6 Jan 1967 in Pine Hills Cem, Scarborough, Ontario, Canada. Bob married Isabella MACKENZIE "Isa" on 12 Jun 1925 in Galt, Ontario, Canada.

Robert served with the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders regiment during WWI and was severely wounded in France from a shrapnel burst. In his younger days he crewed on a yacht in Scotland and also captained his field hockey team that won the Glasgow Celtic Society Shinty Cup two years in a row. Robert was a twin brother of Mary. He immigrated to Canada after WWI and was for many years employed by the City of Toronto. He developed severe skin irritations attributed to his war wounds, (pieces of shrapnel remained embedded in his back all his life). This forced him to seek less active work as a security guard. Robert and his brother John both married MacKenzie sisters as detailed in other notes. Robert was a heavy smoker and this finally caught up to him. In the last few years of his life he developed severe Emphysema, which almost completely disabled him. This progressed to the point that he was hospitalized in the Oakville-Trafalgar hospital where he died in 1967 just one year to the day after the death of his wife. He is buried with his wife in Pine Hills Cemetery, Scarborough, Ontario, Section 5, Grave #1357.



7. **Isabella "Isa" MACKENZIE** was born on 7 Feb 1900 in Badaninal, Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. She died on 4 Jan 1966 in Riverdale Hosp, Toronto, Ontario, Canada. She was buried on 6 Jan 1966 in Pine Hills Cem, Scarborough, Ontario, Canada.

Before immigrating to Canada in 1925, Isabella (she much preferred and was generally known as "Isa"), worked as a cook in a manor estate home known as Glenfinart House near Glasgow where she acquired her well-known recipes for plum pudding and shortbread. During this time, Isa worked with Flora Campbell and was introduced to Flora's brother Robert, Isa's eventual husband, although they would not get married until years later after they had both immigrated to Canada. (Isa and her sister "Peggy" both married Campbell brothers as outlined elsewhere in their respective biographies). While a non-smoker herself, Isa died from lung cancer in Riverdale hospital in Toronto. It is believed her cancer was caused by the second-hand smoke from her husband Bob who was a lifelong heavy smoker. She is buried with her husband in Pine Hills Cemetery, Scarborough, Section 5, Grave #1357.



They had the following children.

- F i. **Catherine Christina CAMPBELL** was born on 8 Jul 1927 in Toronto, York, Ontario, Canada. She died on 17 Jul 2001 in Mississauga, Ontario, Canada. She was buried in Mississauga, Ontario, [cremation].

Cathy died at home of a massive heart attack. After cremation, a private family memorial service was held on 21 July 2001. Her ashes were later scattered at the family cottage.



- F ii. **Maree Euphemia CAMPBELL** was born on 19 Dec 1928 in Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland.

Maree was named after "Loch Maree" in Scotland, so this is a correct name spelling and not a "typo". She is a dedicated duplicate bridge player who now holds "Life Master" status and will travel almost anywhere at any time to participate in a tournament. Maree was born in her mother's family home in Gairloch, Scotland during a visit home by her mother.



- + 3 F iii. **Isabell Margaret CAMPBELL** was born on 15 Sep 1930. She died on 14 Dec 1995.

- F iv. **Elaine Roberta CAMPBELL** was born on 5 Jul 1932 in Toronto, Ontario, Canada. She died in Dec 1968 in Kitchener, Ontario, Canada. She was buried in Dec 1968 in Kitchener, Ontario, Canada.

Elaine took her own life in her home in Kitchener, Ontario just before Christmas in 1968. She had been on a number of medications for a serious kidney infection for some time and it is believed that some sort of drug misadventure or overdose was the root cause of her action.



Third Generation

8. **David WADDELL** was born on 25 May 1856 in Torphichen, West Lothian, Scotland. He died on 16 Jul 1933 in Scone, Perthshire, Scotland. He was buried in Jul 1933 in Scone Cemetery, Scone, Perthshire, Scotland. David married Margaret EADIE on 11 Dec 1876 in Alloa, Clackmannan, Scotland.

Surviving correspondence and photographs seem to indicate that David was both a well-educated and prosperous farmer. His 12 children were reportedly born at the farm known as "Little Camoquhill", (part of a larger estate), near Balfroun, with Bannockburn shown as the location on birth registrations. (The 1911 "Valuation Roll of the County of Stirling", lists "Little Camoquhill" as "part of the estate of Alexander Fairlie Wilson" with David as "Farm Manager" and "inhabitant" and Mary (Kemp) Bryce as "Housekeeper"). Several years after the death of his first wife, David married the twice-widowed Mary (Kemp) Bryce in Balfroun in 1911. It appears they retired sometime after their marriage as it is now known they relocated to "Strathallan Cottage" in Scone where Mary died in 1931. David apparently then moved to his daughter Barbara's home in Scone where he lived out his remaining days. His death extract reports he died of "Apoplexy" (more commonly called a "stroke"), in the presence of his daughter Barbara, (and presumably in her home). The registration for his second marriage in 1911, (see "Marriage14A.jpg") gives his age as 54 and Mary's as 55. David's second oldest son John and his wife Elizabeth signed as witnesses. Marriage Registration (First): "Marriage14.jpg". Marriage Registration (Second): "Marriage14A.jpg". Death Entry: #28/1933 Scone Register. Death Registration: "Death14.jpg". Birth Registration (on "Wheatacre" farm): "Birth14.jpg".



9. **Margaret EADIE** was born on 14 Mar 1857 in Muckhart, Perthshire, Scotland. She was christened on 29 Mar 1857 in Muckhart, Perthshire, Scotland. She died on 1 Jul 1905 in Balfroun, Stirlingshire, Scotland. She was buried in Jul 1905 in the churchyard, Balfroun, Stirlingshire, Scotland.

Little is known about Margaret except that according to my father, her family farmed near Denny, Stirlingshire, ("Casterton Farm"), in the same general area as Balfroun. Some of her brothers and sisters reportedly also had farms nearby. Margaret married David 11 Dec 1876 about three months AFTER their first child Archibald was born. Several generations later, Archie's early birth is no longer a problem but it probably caused a family stir at the time and was most likely a factor in his parents wedding plans. (See notes for Archibald #145.) Family information is that Margaret died of breast cancer. (Scottish female death index, Balfroun 1905 #13.) Marriage registration: "Marriage14.jpg".



They had the following children.

- M i. **Archibald WADDELL** was born on 1 Sep 1876 in Bannockburn, Stirlingshire, Scotland. He died in 1953 in Magnolia, Alberta, Canada. He was buried in 1953 in Magnolia Cemetery, Magnolia, Alberta, Canada.

He was born September 1, 1876, about three months BEFORE the marriage of his parents David and Margaret, and certainly, the stigma of his illegitimacy affected him all his life. Even his headstone in the cemetery in Magnolia, Alberta, simply records his birth as 1876 and his death as 1953. It is now known his parents were married on December 11, 1876 in Alloa, Clackmannanshire, and not in the Denny/Balfroun area of Stirlingshire where both families then farmed and resided. With the passing of time and the people involved, the details of his birth are no longer important except for this record. However, for the times it likely distressed both the Waddell and Eadie families. Incorrect information about his age even appeared on the 1881 British census, and whether or not this was unintended or an attempt to hide his birth details is not now known. Certainly, the 1881 census lists Archie as born in Bothkennar, while his birth extract, reference "Birth145.jpg", registers him in Bannockburn. He was also shown as a younger third-born child, instead of being the first-born in the family as he was known to be. (I clearly recall my father referring to Archie as his oldest brother). The later 1891 census taken at "North Field Farm", Dunipace, Stirling corrects this and gives his age as "15" which, equates with his known birth year of 1876. This census lists Archibald (and his younger brother John), as then living with his Grandmother Margaret Eadie's family. He was not found on the 1901 Scottish census and may have been on his way to Canada at that time.



Whether or not it was because of his birth situation, or something else will never be known, but a life-long animosity reportedly developed between Archie and his father. Archie is known to have expressed the sentiment that "he didn't really feel he was a member of the family." Perhaps because of this, he was also the first of four brothers in the family to immigrate to Canada. He struck out on his own at an early age by taking passage to Canada as a crewman on a small steerage vessel. It is not known just when he arrived in Canada, but it is believed it was in sometime in 1902 as this is the immigration date given for him on the 1906 census. He also shows up, age 35, on the 1911 census at Strassburg, near Regina, Sask. Archie never married and little is known about his early years in Canada other than he eventually settled in Storthoaks, Saskatchewan. At one time he owned two quarters of land (320 acres) in the area but later lost it for back taxes during the depression years of the 1930's. He also established and operated a dray (cartage) business for the local farmers and merchants. In later life, health problems left him near helpless and destitute. He lived out his final days in the home of his brother John in Magnolia, Alberta where he died and was buried in the family plot.

- M ii. **John WADDELL** was born on 1 Apr 1878 in Bothkennar, Stirlingshire, Scotland. He died on 26 Sep 1954 in Magnolia, Alberta, Canada. He was buried in Sep 1954 in Magnolia, Alberta, Canada.

John is listed on the 1891 Scottish census on his grandmother Margaret Eadie's farm "North Field". For the early part of his married life, John helped his father farm "Little Camoquihill" (part of the Wilson estate). Here, the first three of his children were born. Around the time of his father's second marriage, John moved to a farm known as "Wester Gerchew" near the Endrich river not far from Balfroun. This was part of a larger estate, "Ballikinrain Castle", then owned by Lord and Lady Allen, (the founders of the Allen Line Steamship Company). Here, the rest of John's family was born. According to his youngest daughter Belle, their lifestyle was reasonably comfortable for the times. This would change.



At the urging of John's oldest son Dave, (who had previously immigrated to Canada and had established a homestead farm west of Edmonton in Alberta), John and most of the family then still in Scotland, now immigrated to Canada in 1938. In Belle's words: "We left behind a comfortable stone house with electricity, indoor plumbing and all the other amenities". They were now faced with carving out a homestead farm in what were then the wilds of mid-western Alberta and began their new life in Canada in a log shack. Belle recalls it took a long time to get used to the severity of the winters in those early days "as often ice remained in the water pails inside the shack in spite of a roaring fire".

- F iii. **Margaret WADDELL** was born on 1 Jul 1879 in Bothkennar, Stirlingshire, Scotland. She died on 17 Dec 1952 in Renfrew, Scotland.

Margaret was the oldest girl in a family of 12 children. The 1881 census taken at the family home on Bothkennar, Stirling lists her as "age 3". Margaret was described as a kind, warm-hearted person but reportedly was quite outspoken and was later said to have been highly critical of her father's re-marriage. (see #14). It is also reported that Margaret had an urge to gamble and apparently liked to get her bets down at both the horse and dog races. The 1901 census shows her still at her parents' home, unmarried, but with a year-old daughter. Birth Registration: "Birth310.jpg".



- F iv. **Jane WADDELL** was born on 30 Jan 1881 in Bothkennar, Stirlingshire, Scotland. She died on 11 May 1903 in Bannockburn, Stirlingshire, Scotland. She was buried in May 1903 in Bannockburn, Stirlingshire, Scotland.

Birth Registration: "Birth314.jpg"

- F v. **Mary WADDELL** was born on 9 Oct 1882 in Bothkennar, Stirlingshire, Scotland. She died on 20 Jan 1966 in Scotland.

Reportedly there were 3 children in her marriage. A girl Margaret died 25 Feb 1917 at age eight. There was a boy named Robert. No other data available. LDS Library Call #0960741 1553194. Birth Registration: "Birth312.jpg".

- M vi. **David WADDELL** was born on 17 May 1885 in Bannockburn, Stirlingshire, Scotland. He died on 29 Aug 1979 in Toronto, Ontario, Canada. He was buried in 1979 in Toronto, Ontario, Canada.

He was a well-proportioned mountain of a man, well over 6' tall and by far the tallest of four tall brothers in this family. Like his other brothers, Dave immigrated to Canada from Scotland sometime in the early 1900's. (The 1906 census lists only one "David", single, born in Scotland, age 23, hired man, in Assinaboia, Sask., and gives the year of immigration as 1906). He later held a variety of jobs in Quebec and Ontario before eventually settling in Toronto where he raised his family. Until retirement, Dave worked as a freight handler for the CN railway in Toronto. His work location was only a short distance from where we lived prior to the war, so I often saw him and knew him well. In later life he suffered a debilitating stroke from which he never fully recovered. He was in his 95th year when he died in a nursing home in the east end of Toronto. Birth reference: Birth146.jpg.



- + 4 M vii. **James "Scotty" WADDELL** was born on 6 Sep 1886. He died on 22 Feb 1969.

- F viii. **Janet WADDELL** was born on 30 Jan 1888 in Bannockburn, Stirlingshire, Scotland. She died in unknown date in Scotland.

The 1891 Census records list her as Janet, but it is believed she may have been known as Jean. Birth Registration: "Birth313.jpg".

- F ix. **Grace WADDELL** was born on 15 Nov 1889 in Bannockburn, Stirlingshire, Scotland. She died in 1902 in Balfroun, Stirlingshire, Scotland.

Reportedly died in her early teens. Birth Registration: "Birth315.jpg", records she was born in "Plean Mill Cottages, Bannockburn".

- F x. **Barbara WADDELL** was born on 18 Jan 1892 in Bannockburn, Stirlingshire, Scotland. She died on 18 Jun 1940 in Scone, Perth, Scotland.

Barbara never married and died of a heart attack at her home in Scone at the relatively young age of 48. She shows on the 1901 Balfon census with her parents and other family members then at home. After her father David's second wife died, he moved into her home where he lived out his days. (Barbara was not the oldest daughter but was said to have been her father's favourite). She apparently stirred up the family when she made her father's funeral arrangements and buried him near her home, (in Scone cemetery, Perthshire), instead of beside his first wife Margaret Eadie in the family plot in Balfon Cemetery. Birth reference: Birth148.jpg. Death reference: Death148.jpg.



- F xi. **Isabella "Bella" WADDELL** was born on 3 Mar 1895 in Larbert, Stirlingshire, Scotland. She died on 24 Sep 1910 in Little Camoquhill, Balfon, Stirlingshire, Scotland. She was buried on 28 Sep 1910 in Balfon Cemetery, Balfon, Stirlingshire, Scotland.

Isabella's death date and location is recorded in a surviving letter written to my Uncle John by my grandfather. The letter, (the only example of my grandfather's handwriting that I have), is appended as "Death316.jpg" in the multi-media section of this file. In the ornate penmanship common at the time, the letter formally outlines Isabella's death and burial arrangements. The letter and envelope are both edged in black ink as was the custom for death notices at that time. Birth Registration: "Birth316.jpg".

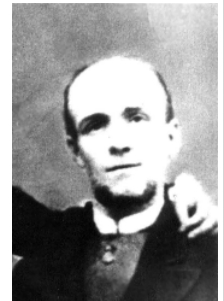


- F xii. **Marion WADDELL** was born on 28 Jan 1897 in Balfon, Stirlingshire, Scotland. She died after 1901 in Stirlingshire, Scotland.

The last-born in the family. She reportedly died as a young child sometime after the 1901 census. Birth Registration: "Birth311.jpg".

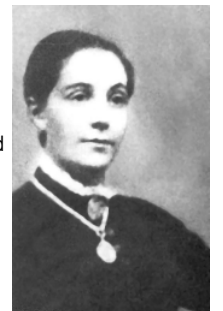
10. **John Thomas HARDING** was born on 4 Oct 1858 in East Langton, Harborough, Leicester, England. He died in Nov 1943 in Sioux Lookout, Ontario, Canada. He was buried in Canada. John married Catherine PROSSER "Kate" in Sep 1879 in St. Pancras, London, England.

John was the only grandparent I was ever able to meet. This was in 1936 when I was 8 and I visited with my mother at his farm near Lafleche, Sask. The 1881 British census lists him working as a waiter in St. Pancras, London, England, where he married and his first child was born. On April 16, 1892 he sailed from Liverpool on the "Lake Huron" and landed in Montreal, Canada on April 26 with his wife and four surviving children. (The year of immigration is confirmed on the 1901 Canadian census Film # T-6515, page 5 "Census 16.jpg"). Settling first in Brome County in the eastern part of Quebec, he reportedly worked as a carpenter for Mr. Adams, the founder of Adamsville, Quebec and then later farmed locally. The remaining three children in the family, (including my mother), were born and raised here. In 1907, John went west to Saskatchewan to try his hand at homesteading and on June 13, 1908, he filed for a land grant near present-day Lafleche. He built a sod shanty to establish his homestead and moved there the following Spring with his wife and two youngest children, Clara (13), and Joe (10). The rest of the family including my mother remained in Quebec at that time, although most of them later moved west to farm near Lafleche as well. Reportedly, one of John's brothers immigrated from England to Johannesburg, S. Africa where he is said to have established a "plantation" -- but no evidence has been found to support this. Two of John's sisters who remained in England reportedly became Nuns but again, no evidence has been found to support this. John was living with his youngest son Joe in Sioux Lookout, Ontario, when he died in 1943. Birth reference: "Birth16.jpg"



11. **Catherine "Kate" PROSSER** was born on 2 Apr 1859 in St Martins, Hereford, England. She died in 1936 in Battleford, Sask, Canada. She was buried in 1936 in Sask, Canada.

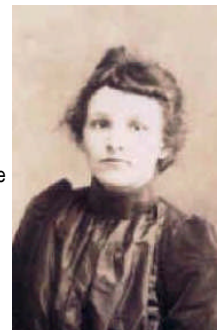
Little is known about Catherine other than she was born in England and immigrated to Canada early in 1892 along with her husband and four surviving children. The 1901 census for Adamsville, Brome County, Quebec confirms the date of immigration as 1892 and lists the family then still at home, including my mother. Catherine had been pregnant during the voyage over as my mother was born in Adamsville, Quebec shortly after the family arrived in Canada. Catherine's travels were not yet over as she later accompanied her husband and their two youngest children to a homestead farm near Lafleche, Sask. Whether or not the rigors of pioneering and the severe prairie winters had become a factor will never be known, but Catherine was later confined to a mental institution. She died there, reportedly of a brain tumour.



They had the following children.

- F i. **Ethel Mary HARDING** was born on 2 Jun 1880 in St Pancras, London, England. She was christened on 2 Nov 1880 in St Pancras, London, England. She died on 11 Apr 1925 in Moose Jaw, Sask, Canada. She was buried in 1925 in Moose Jaw, Sask, Canada.

Ethel is shown on the 1881 census for London, Middlesex (age 10 months) with her father and mother. At the time of the 1901 Canadian census, Ethyl was not listed with the rest of the Harding family as she was then married and living with Harry Hitz on a neighbouring farm. They later moved west and after several stops, eventually settled in Moose Jaw where Ethel took sick with pneumonia and died at age 45. Marriage reference: Marriage398.jpg.



- M ii. **John Frederick (Fred) HARDING** was born on 24 Feb 1883 in Monks Copenhall, Crewe,

Chester, England. He died on 10 Jul 1967 in Melaval, Sask, Canada. He was buried in Jul 1967 in Melaval, Sask, Canada.

John was his first given name, however he was generally known as Fred. He was a general all-purpose tradesman. He moved to Nova Scotia for a while where he became the construction superintendent for the Moirs Chocolate factory built in Halifax. He met his wife Rose at the factory and sometime after their marriage they then moved west in 1917 and raised their family in Saskatchewan. There were 12 children in the family with the last 9 born on the family farm and the births registered at nearby Lafleche. He built his own house on his father's farm then later moved to a farm of his own. As well as farming, he operated his own blacksmith shop repairing neighbourhood farm machinery. His carpentry skills were also used to make coffins for the neighbours when they died. When his sister and her husband, (Clara & Bob Fogal), decided to travel and take on custom farming in the USA, Fred built them their first house trailer.

In 1936, I met John and Rose for the first and only time. My mother and I had taken a train trip west and were making the rounds visiting the families of her sister, brothers and her father. I was only 8 at the time, and a city kid who had never been on a farm, so the rural prairie lifestyle in the 1930's was quite an experience for me. (No flush toilets or electricity, and the heat, dust and grasshoppers were oppressive). Their 3 youngest boys and I were all about the same age and they were soon showing this city kid how to set traps for gophers -- (although I don't recall that we caught any). What I recall, is that I thought it was great fun to sneak away behind the barn and chase the hens to get them flying every which way. They had a young pup that soon joined in with me. That was fine, until one time he caught, killed and started to eat a hen. I went back to the house and told on him. One of the older brothers then said, "Well, we can't have a dog on a farm that kills and eats chickens" and with that, he took the dog out behind the barn -- *and killed him*. That certainly left a lasting impression on me. I was smart enough to keep the circumstances to myself, and my mother never did hear the truth of it. (It's not something I'm proud of -- but I was only 8 -- and it WAS fun chasing the hens).

- M iii. **Franklin "Frank" HARDING** was born on 14 Mar 1885 in Crewe, Chester, England. He died on 14 Nov 1962 in Vancouver, BC, Canada. He was buried in BC, Canada.

Although he was always known as "Frank", his full given name was "Franklin" according to the 1901 Canadian census taken at the family farm in Adamsville, Quebec. At that time, all the children with the exception of the oldest daughter Ethel, were at home and listed on the census. (Ethel had married Harry Hitz from a neighbouring farm and the census lists her as living with her husbands' family). The same census also confirms 1892 as the year the Harding family immigrated to Canada from England. Frank farmed in Quebec for a while, then like his older brother, he headed west to try his hand at homesteading. He is picked up on the 1911 census near Yorkton, Sask., and sometime afterwards he established his own homestead. In 1936 when my mother and I made the rounds to visit relatives, I'm sure we visited Frank and Alice at that time but I've no recollection of meeting them.

- M iv. **George HARDING** was born on 20 Jul 1889 in Crewe, Chester, England. He died in unknown date in Montreal, Quebec, Canada. He was buried in Quebec, Canada.

It is known that there were at least seven children in George's family. Birth order and other details are not known but the reported names were Doreen, Elsie, Eileen, Marjorie, Stanley, Ernest and Herbert. He is picked up on the 1911 census, age 21, unmarried and living in Montreal.

- M v. **Alfred HARDING** was born about 1890 in Crewe, Chester, England. He died in 1890 (3Q) in Wirral, Chester, England. He was buried in England.

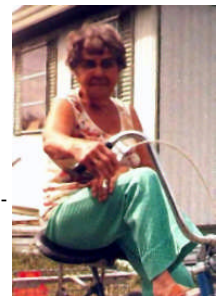
Family oral history reports that Alfred became very sick as a young child and his father went to get the Doctor and (presumably while waiting for him), reportedly got to drinking and wound up in a gambling game. When he returned home, Alfred was found dead in his mother's arms. In 1892, the family immigrated to Canada and settled in Adamsville, Quebec where the last three children in his family, including my mother, were born. (See #16)

- + 5 F vi. **Marjorie Louise HARDING** was born on 23 Aug 1892. She died on 18 Jul 1973.

- F vii. **Clara HARDING** was born on 9 May 1895 in Adamsville, Brome Cty, Quebec, Canada. She was christened on 3 Nov 1895 in Adamsville, Brome Cty, Quebec, Canada. She died on 8 Dec 1984 in Tampa, FL, USA. She was buried in Tampa, FL, [cremation].

Clara was only 13 in 1909, when with her parents and 10 year-old brother Joe, she moved from the family farm in Adamsville, Quebec to take up the life of pioneers on the prairies near Lafleche, Sask. During one visit I had with her at her retirement home near Tampa Florida a year or so before she died, she told me they took the train to Regina, Sask., (then the end of the line), where her father purchased a team and wagon and other supplies. They then set off on a three-day trek, (sleeping under the wagon at night), across the grasslands to their new home that was a sod shanty her father had built the year before. It was not that many years since the last great herds of buffalo had passed that way, so laughingly, she said that one of the first chores she and her brother Joe had for a while, was to collect the "buffalo chips" that were then still in great abundance. These were piled near the walls of the shanty and used for fuel.

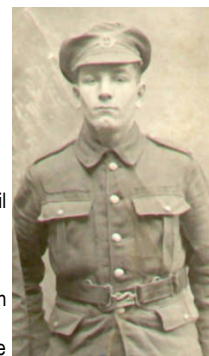
In 1936 my mother and I visited Clara and Bob on their farm near Lafleche. (We made a circuit and met all with my mothers' brothers and their families at that time). I don't have a lot of recollections, but I do vividly recall we were caught in a tornado that hit one night while we were at Clara's. We all huddled in the cellar. (I was carried to the cellar as I was asleep when the storm hit and didn't know about it till morning). Fortunately, there was no real damage to the house or barn as I recall, and the horses were OK. *But the outhouse was carried away and never found -- leaving me wondering just where it went and if someone had received an unexpected 'surprise'*. I also remember that a wagon my uncle was working on, was picked up and dropped basically undamaged in the next field. The storm cut a very narrow swath, as farms on either side were not even touched. (This was all very mysterious and left a lasting impression on an eight-year old city kid who had never been on a farm before).



Clara died at her retirement home in Tampa, Florida. After cremation there, her ashes were returned to Lafleche and scattered on the old homestead still owned and farmed today by some of her descendants.

M viii. **Joseph HARDING** was born on 19 May 1899 in Adamsville, Brome Cty, Quebec, Canada. He died on 25 Jan 1963 in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada. He was buried in 1963 in Sioux Lookout, Ontario, Canada.

Joe served with the Canadian Army in WW I and was wounded four times. (He was only 16 when he ran away from home to enlist in March of 1915. He lied about his age and joined up as an under-age volunteer -- regimental #925501). After discharge from the Army, he got a job with CN Rail as a fireman and later became an engineer. In WW II, he joined up again and this time served as a stoker with the Canadian Navy. After discharge, he resumed employment with CN Rail as a locomotive engineer in the coal-fired steam engine days. As he then lived in Sioux Lookout, Ontario, his work section included the northern Ontario bush country from Winnipeg to Port Arthur (now Thunder bay). In this section, he told me that train crews often encountered deer and moose on the tracks. (They came to feed on the grain that spilled from the freight cars). Mostly, they would move when the horn was sounded, but in rutting season, the moose would often stand their ground, particularly the big bulls who would sometimes even charge the engine as they attempted to defend their territory. Joe said the train never even shuddered as bits of blood, bone and hide would splatter along the side of the engine. It must have been quite an experience!



12. **Alexander CAMPBELL** was born on 22 Sep 1862 in Rothesay, Bute, Scotland. He died on 12 Jun 1938 in Kilbride, Argyll, Scotland. He was buried in Jun 1938 in Kilbride, Argyll, Scotland. Alexander married Euphemia KENNEDY on 29 Nov 1881 in Achourk, Kilfinan, Argyll, Scotland.

Many of the details of Alexander's parentage have long been shrouded in mystery and family secrecy, mainly because of his illegitimate birth. However, it is known he was raised as a Campbell on the Isle of Bute by the Macleans of Mechnock. There was only ONE "Alexander Campbell" who had a birth registered in Bute in his known birth year of 1862 and it confirms an illegitimate birth to a "Mary Campbell, 17 year-old unmarried factory worker." Mary registered the birth herself on 10 Oct 1862 and her "mark" was witnessed by the Registrar. Birth registration: "Birth44.jpg". LDS birth reference: C115581.

While Alexander's mother is now known, the mystery continues in respect to the actual identity of Alexander's father. It's almost certain his father was a "Campbell" given the circumstances, and was most likely even a close family member. Alexander was raised and later married as a Campbell, but his mother obviously had a "Macleane" connection to have had a Maclean family raise him. It's also noted that Alexander later used "Macleane" as the second or third given name for some of his children, something he would not have done without a close Maclean family connection. His maternal grandparents turned out to be the answer. Alexander's mother Mary was the daughter of a Donald Campbell who married a Maclean, and it was this Maclean family side of his mother's parents who raised him. (See notes for Mary Campbell #696.) Alexander was buried in grave #109, Kilbride Cemetery next to his wife who was buried in grave #108.



13. **Euphemia KENNEDY** was born on 27 Feb 1861 in Kilfinan, Argyll, Scotland. She died on 26 May 1932 in Kilbride, Argyll, Scotland. She was buried in May 1932 in Kilbride, Argyll, Scotland.

She appears on the 1861 Scottish census (age 1), taken at "Auchork Farm" with her father, mother and three siblings. It is known that Alexander and Euphemia were married at "Achourk", in Kilfinan Parish by the Reverend Mcfee, Minister of Portnahaven, Isle of Islay. They were married in one of the cottages of Achourk and then lived in the upper of the two cottages by the ruins of Ascog Castle. Euphemia was buried in grave #108, Kilbride Cemetery, next to her husband Alexander who was buried in grave #109.

They had the following children.

M i. **Archibald CAMPBELL** was born on 20 Jul 1881 in Tighnabruaich, Argyll, Scotland. He died in 1947 in London, Ontario, Canada. He was buried in 1947 in London, Ontario, Canada.

After the death of his first wife (Janet #66), due to childbirth complications, Archibald left his daughter Marion with his mother who raised her as her own. Archibald later immigrated to Canada where he married (Bertha #68), and started a second family. (See notes for Janet #66 and Kenneth #69).

M ii. **Donald "Dan" CAMPBELL** was born in 1883 in Tighnabruaich, Argyll, Scotland. He died after 1955 in Kitchener, Ontario, Canada. He was buried in Kitchener, Ontario, Canada.

No information as to why he chose and was known publicly as "Dan" when his given name was actually "Donald". He was a widower when I first met him at the time of my wedding to his niece Isabell and Dan was often a frequent visitor at her parents home, often staying on at his brothers' house for weeks at a time. I soon found out the reason for this was that when his own family tired of his frequent argumentative moods, they would encourage him to make a round of family 'visits'. He certainly held very strong views on most any subject, and if you didn't happen to agree with him, you heard about it in no uncertain terms. If you didn't agree with him, there was an argument -- and when he got together with his brothers, it usually didn't take long. He could also well have been the model for the time-honoured "thrifty" Scotsman. Certainly I can't recall any indication of him contributing to the family coffers for his extended 'visits'. I also remember an occasion when I innocently got involved. I noticed he was wearing his house slippers on the opposite feet, and thinking he might not be aware of this, I made the mistake of mentioning it to him. He tore into me with his strong Scottish brogue and very bluntly stated: "It's deliberate as it serves to even up the wear".



- M iii. **Alexander "Sandy" CAMPBELL** was born in 1885 in Tighnabruaich, Argyll, Scotland. He died in Dec 1972 in Kilbride, Scotland. He was buried in Dec 1972 in Kilbride, Scotland.

Buried at Kilbride Cemetery, Grave #110. He apparently never married.



- F iv. **Isabella CAMPBELL** was born in 1887 in Tighnabruaich, Argyll, Scotland. She died about 1958 in Buena Park, CA, USA. She was buried about 1958 in Buena Park, CA, USA.

- M v. **John CAMPBELL** was born on 13 Mar 1889 in Tighnabruaich, Argyll, Scotland. He died on 5 Jul 1970 in Toronto, Ontario, Canada. He was buried in Jul 1970 in (Cremation), Toronto, Ontario, Canada.

A retired Metropolitan Toronto Police Officer. His granddaughter, and her husband, are now also with the Metropolitan Toronto Police. John and his brother Robert both married MacKenzie sisters.



- M vi. **Angus CAMPBELL** was born in 1892 in Tighnabruaich, Argyll, Scotland. He died on 27 Jan 1917 in France. He was buried in 1917 in Stirlingshire, Scotland (Memorial).

He immigrated to Canada prior to 1914 where he met and married Elizabeth Kent, (believed to be in the Alberta area), sometime before he went overseas with the Canadian Army. He served with an Alberta regiment known as the "Calgary Highlanders" and was killed at "Hill 60" in France in 1917. The Commonwealth War Graves Registration Commission confirms this, reporting him as a Lance Corporal, (Regimental #446372), and to have died 27 January 1917 at age 24. His remains were apparently never identified for a formal burial. "Commemorative" information from the War Graves Commission lists his grave location as the "Denny & Dunipace Cemetery" in Stirlingshire, Scotland under reference #1377.

- M vii. **Hugh CAMPBELL** was born in 1893 in Tighnabruaich, Argyll, Scotland. He died after 1955 in Galt, Ontario, Canada. He was buried after 1955 in Galt, Ontario, Canada.

- + 6 M viii. **Robert Blythe "Bob" CAMPBELL** was born on 2 Apr 1896. He died on 4 Jan 1967.

- F ix. **Mary MacLean CAMPBELL** was born on 2 Apr 1896 in Tighnabruaich, Argyll, Scotland. She died in 1976 in New Forest, Hants, England. She was buried in (cremation) in New Forest, Hants, England.

TWIN: a sister of Robert #9. After a cremation service, her ashes were scattered at New Forest, Hants, England.

- M x. **Hector Peter MacLean CAMPBELL** was born on 15 Apr 1898 in Tighnabruaich, Argyll, Scotland. He died in 1971 in Long Beach Is, NJ, USA. He was buried in (cremation) in Long Beach Island.

He preferred and was always known as "Pete" rather than by his first name of Hector. He was the only known member of his family to immigrate to the USA. Other family members either came to Canada or remained in Scotland. Pete's cremation ashes were scattered in the ocean near his home on Long Beach Island, New Jersey.



- F xi. **Euphemia "Effie" CAMPBELL** was born in 1900 in Tighnabruaich, Argyll, Scotland. She died in 1980 in Scotland. She was buried in 1980 in Scotland.



- F xii. **Flora (Flossie) CAMPBELL** was born on 3 Apr 1902 in Tighnabruaich, Argyll, Scotland. She died in 1990 in Glasgow, Scotland. She was buried in (cremation) in Argyll, Scotland.

Flora was her Christening name, but she was known as "Flossie". Her maiden surname was "Campbell" before her marriage to George Campbell, although there is no known family connection between what are apparently otherwise two separate Campbell families. Flora's cremation ashes were scattered near the family homestead close by the ruins of Ascog castle.



- F xiii. **Margaret CAMPBELL** was born about 1903 in Tighnabruaich, Argyll, Scotland. She died about 1905 in Argyll, Scotland. She was buried about 1905 in Argyll, Scotland.

Reportedly "died as a young child".

- M xiv. **Dugal CAMPBELL** was born about 1905 in Tighnabruaich, Argyll, Scotland. He died in 1968 in Kilbrachen, Scotland. He was buried in 1968 in Kilbrachen, Scotland.

Reportedly an ardent trout fisherman and a champion darts player.



14. **Hector MACKENZIE** was born on 17 Apr 1860 in Badaninal, Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. He died after 1909 in Badaninal, Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. He was buried in Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. Hector married Christina MACLEAN "Christy" on 25 Apr 1889 in Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland.

He made his living as a fisherman and was also the local sail-maker. Hector and Kate had 11 children all born in the small fishing village of Gairloch. The first 5 were born in "Badachro" House and the last 6 in "Badininal" House. His birth registration is referenced as "Birth21.jpg".



15. **Christina "Christy" MACLEAN** was born on 18 Mar 1866 in Badaninal, Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. She died on 28 Mar 1935 in Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. She was buried in 1935 in Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland.

Nothing is known about Christina other than she apparently lived all her life in Gairloch where she raised 11 children. LDS Birth Reference: C110661



They had the following children.

- F i. **Catherine (Kate) MACKENZIE** was born on 4 Oct 1890 in Badachro, Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. She died after 1933 in London, England. She was buried in Brompton, London, England.

Kate reportedly committed suicide in London, England by jumping from a bridge into the Thames river and drowning.

- M ii. **Alexander MACKENZIE** was born on 19 Oct 1892 in Badachro, Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. He died in Mar 1973 in Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. He was buried in Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland.

Alexander was apparently quite short in stature and so acquired the Gaelic nickname of "Wee Ec", (or "Little Alec".) A bachelor all his life, he was the last MacKenzie to own and live in "Badaninal" house in Gairloch which for several generations had been a major part of the family homestead. (He sold it for £100 (UK Sterling) in 1957 when he thought he was getting a "bit old".) He then moved a short distance away -- and carried his furniture on his back -- over the hills to his new home "Port Henderson". (This is reportedly about a 20-minute walk -- without furniture.) Birth Registration: "Birth177.jpg".

- M iii. **John MACKENZIE** was born on 11 Jun 1894 in Badachro, Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. He died in Jul 1957 in Taber, Alberta, Canada. He was buried in Taber, Alberta, Canada.

John immigrated to Canada -- date unknown -- and remained a bachelor all his life. For the latter part of his life in Canada, he lived and worked as a shepherd on the Benson ranch which, at that time was one of the largest free-range sheep ranches in the vast prairie flatlands of southwestern Alberta. It was a life of isolation -- many miles from the nearest town of Taber -- with only the sheep and his herd dogs for company. His sisters Isa and Peggy, niece Maree (Campbell) Logan and myself, attended his funeral. We later visited his last campsite and I vividly recall the serenity of this location. Without a tree or any man-made structure in sight, one could turn in any direction and see only the flat prairie grassland right up to the horizon. If you wanted to be alone with your thoughts, this surely had to be the place. Birth registration: "Birth178.jpg".

- M iv. **Roderick MACKENZIE** was born on 10 Jun 1896 in Badachro, Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. He died after 1918 in Argyll, Scotland. He was buried after 1918 in Argyll, Scotland.

Roderick was in the British Navy during WW I and reportedly worked as a fencer in Oban, Argyllshire, after the war.

- F v. **Maggie MACKENZIE** was born on 28 Feb 1898 in Badachro, Wester Ross, Scotland. She died on 29 Mar 1990 in Riverdale Hosp, Toronto, Ontario, Canada. She was buried on 31 Mar 1990 in (Cremation), Toronto, Ontario, Canada.

Both her Christening & Birth Certificates state that "Maggie" was her given name. However, it was a name she apparently didn't like as she chose to use and was known publicly, as Margaret, or the nickname Peggy. She immigrated to Canada in 1925 with her sister Isabella (Isa) when Isa was coming to Canada to marry Robert Campbell. It was at this time that Peggy was introduced to and eventually married, Robert's brother John.



- + 7 F vi. **Isabella "Isa" MACKENZIE** was born on 7 Feb 1900. She died on 4 Jan 1966.

- M vii. **Murdo "Mass" MACKENZIE** was born on 16 May 1902 in Badaninal, Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. He died on 6 Mar 1977 in Toronto, Ontario, Canada. He was buried in Mar 1977 in Toronto, Ontario, Canada.

According to his sisters, the nickname "Mass" was derived from "Massacre". He was said to have been the strongest boy in school where he reportedly seldom lost a schoolyard fight. It was always a "massacre" - hence the nickname. He immigrated to Canada sometime after WWI -- date unknown. He served overseas with the Canadian Army during WWII (and with a nickname like "Mass" it was good to know he was on our side.) After the war and until his death, Mass was employed by the City of Toronto works department. He married sometime after the war but sadly his wife almost immediately took ill and was admitted to hospital where she died shortly afterwards.

- F viii. **Ann (Annie) MACKENZIE** was born on 27 Dec 1904 in Badaninal, Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland.



- F ix. **Christina (Chrissie) MACKENZIE** was born on 27 Sep 1906 in Badaninal, Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland.

At this writing Chrissie was living in "Port Henderson House", which was formerly owned by her brother Alec. (She had nursed him through a period of ill health and before he died he willed the house to her). Chrissie never married.



- F x. **Maisie MACKENZIE** was born on 6 May 1908 in Badaninal, Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland.

- M xi. **Hector MACKENZIE** was born on 10 May 1910 in Badaninal, Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. He died in 1973 in Paisley, Scotland. He was buried in 1973 in Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland.

Forth Generation

16. **Archibald WADDELL** was born about 1802 in Bathgate, Linlithgow, Scotland. He died on 21 Mar 1878 in Muiravonside, Stirlingshire, Scotland. He was buried in Muiravonside, Stirlingshire, Scotland. Archibald married Jane RENNIE "Jean" on 8 Aug 1843 in Muiravonside, Stirlingshire, Scotland.

Archibald's birth year was calculated from information supplied by his son Robert (who was the Informant), on the death extract registered in 1878, which gave his age at death as "76 years". This established a birth year of approximately 1802. (However, the 1841 census for Wheatacre (Wetacre) farm at Torphichen, where he is shown with other family members, gives his birth year as "Abt 1806"). It is believed he was born in Bathgate, Linlithgow, (West

Lothian), as this is the birth location given on both the 1851 and 1861 census listings at the same farm location. The 1861 census records him as a farmer of 55 acres and lists his wife Jean (Jane) and the 9 children born to them at the time of the census. In the 1871 census, the family is now listed at "Boxton Rigghead farm", with 8 children then at home, his wife Jane and her mother Mary Graham. It is known that he married Jane at Muiravonside, Stirling, 8 Aug 1843. Given his age of approximately 41 in 1843, this may have been a second marriage for him, although there is no information to support this. It is also noted that his death registration, lists his mother's given name ONLY as Mary, (although it was later determined his mother's surname was "Wilson"). Archibald's death registration also INCORRECTLY listed his father as "Archibald" instead of "Alexander". (Why his son who was the "Informant" never changed this, or had it corrected, is not now known). Archibald died before his wife Jane, as the 1881 census at Foggermount, Muiravonside lists Jane as his widow. The cause of death was reported as "Intussusception of the bowels, 7 days", a medical term describing a severe constriction in the intestines, an incurable condition at that time. Marriage record: LDS M114864. Death Reference: "Death215.jpg".

17. **Jane "Jean" RENNIE** was born about 1819 in Muiravonside, Stirlingshire, Scotland. She was christened on 20 Jun 1821 in Muiravonside, Stirlingshire, Scotland. She died on 14 Feb 1902 in Falkirk, Stirlingshire, Scotland. She was buried in Stirlingshire, Scotland.

Jane was listed as a widow in the 1881 census taken at Foggermount, Muiravonside, (LDS film #0203543.) Also shown on this census were daughters Mary (age 36) and Barbara (age 24), with both of them listed as unmarried. A "grandson" Archibald Waddell, age 10, was also listed. (He was apparently the illegitimate son of Janet #921). The handwriting on the Christening records for the first six of Jane's children may have been blurred or distorted as in the transcription, her maiden surname was mistakenly interpreted and transcribed on the LDS Fiche #C116715 as "Rankin" instead of "Rennie". Her youngest son Robert was the 'Informant' for her death registration reporting her age at death as 83. Death Reference: "Death655.jpg".

They had the following children.

- F i. **Mary WADDELL** was born on 1 Sep 1844 in Torphichen, West Lothian, Scotland. She died on 3 Apr 1884 in Muiravonside, Stirlingshire, Scotland.

Christening reference: LDS C116715. GROS: 671 0030 0087. The mother's name is listed as "Rankin". Mary is recorded as a dressmaker, "unmarried" and living with her mother on the 1881 census taken at Foggermount.

- F ii. **Jean (Jane) WADDELL** was born on 19 Oct 1845 in Torphichen, West Lothian, Scotland. She died in unknown date.

Christening Reference: LDS C116715. Marriage reference: LDS #M114861. Birth reference: GROS 671 0030 0088. (Mother's name is listed as "Rankin".)

- M iii. **Alexander WADDELL** was born on 25 Apr 1847 in Torphichen, West Lothian, Scotland. He died in unknown date in West Lothian, Scotland.

Alexander is found with his wife Mary and family on three consecutive census listings in Kilsyth, 1881, 1891 & 1901. Birth Reference: GROS 671 0030 0092.

- F iv. **Marion WADDELL** was born on 4 Feb 1849 in Torphichen, West Lothian, Scotland. She died before 1861 in Torphichen, West Lothian, Scotland.

Christening reference: LDS C116715. Mother's name is listed as "Rankin". GROS: 671 0030 0095.

- M v. **James WADDELL** was born on 2 Dec 1850 in Torphichen, West Lothian, Scotland. He died in unknown date.

Christening Reference: LDS C116715 gives the mother's name as "Rankin". (Unproven. He may have married Jane Burns 11 Aug 1874, Denny, Stirlingshire. Reference: LDS # M114761).

- M vi. **Archibald WADDELL** was born on 3 Oct 1852 in Torphichen, West Lothian, Scotland. He died in unknown date.

Christening reference: LDS C 116715. The mother's name is listed as "Rankin".

- F vii. **Janet WADDELL** was born on 18 Jun 1854 in Torphichen, West Lothian, Scotland. She died in unknown date.

Christening reference: LDS C 116715. Mother's name is listed as "Rankin". It is believed Jane never married, but apparently she did have an illegitimate son.

- + 8 M viii. **David WADDELL** was born on 25 May 1856. He died on 16 Jul 1933.

- F ix. **Barbra WADDELL** was born on 21 Jul 1858 in Torphichen, West Lothian, Scotland. She died in unknown date.

Shown living at home with her mother on the 1881 census at Foggermount. Listed as an unemployed domestic servant. Birth reference: LDS # C116711.

- M x. **Robert WADDELL** was born on 10 Sep 1860 in Torphichen, West Lothian, Scotland. He died in unknown date in Scotland.

His son's birth registration reports him as a "farmer". Birth Reference: LDS # C116711. Robert was the "Informant" for his father's death registration (and who for reasons unknown, never corrected the WRONG information about his G-Grandfathers' given name on this registration). The 1891 census lists him, wife Elizabeth and four children at "Stand Rigg" farm, Muiravonside.

- M xi. **John WADDELL** was born on 18 May 1862 in Torphichen, West Lothian, Scotland. He died before 1866 in Scotland.

It would appear he died at an early age and was "replaced" with a brother of the same name -- see #661.

- M xii. **John WADDELL** was born on 13 Jul 1866 in Muiravonside, Stirlingshire, Scotland. He died in 1946 in Falkirk, Stirlingshire, Scotland.

The last of 11 known children in this family. It appears he was named as a "replacement" for an older sibling in this family who had died at a young age. John farmed "Greenbank" farm and it remains with his descendants at this writing, (Spring 2001). The farm overlooks the Wallace Memorial built as a tribute to the victory by the Scottish over the English at the battle of Stirling Bridge in 1297. Birth Reference: LDS #C114861

18. **John EADIE** was born in Mar 1819 in St Martins, Muckart, Perth, Scotland. He was christened on 7 Mar 1819 in St Martins, Muckart, Perth, Scotland. He died on 8 Dec 1888 in Dunipace, Stirlingshire, Scotland. He was buried in Scotland. John married Margaret SINCLAIR on 9 Jan 1852 in Muckhart, Perth, Scotland.

The family surname is recorded as "Eadie" in these listings for John, his siblings and in subsequent family entries. However, the surname may originally have been spelled "Eddie" as some listings uncovered for him and his known siblings used "Eddie", (which of course could also have been a clerical error.)

Family oral history reports that John was a prosperous farmer near Denny ("Casterton Farm"), where he reportedly raised, sold and exhibited Clydesdale horses. Many of the horses were said to have been appropriated by the Government, without compensation, to pull gun carriages. The 1861 census at the family farm "Cowden", Muckhart, Perth, records him with wife Margaret and 5 children. The 1881 census taken at "Casterton Farm" lists him as a "Farmer of 258 acres of which 124 are arable". Reference: FHL Film #0203544, Ref Volume 488-2, District 6, Page 9. John's death extract, ("Death167.jpg"), reports that he died, age 70, from a skull fracture resulting from a hay loft fall.



19. **Margaret SINCLAIR** was born on 27 Nov 1830 in Muckhart, Perthshire, Scotland. She was christened on 12 Dec 1830 in Muckhart, Perthshire, Scotland. She died after 1891 in Stirlingshire, Scotland.

The 1881 census taken at Casterton Farm, St. Ninians, Stirling lists Margaret as having been born in Muckhart, Perth, Scotland. Margaret was on the 1891 census as a widow, but by 1901 she was not listed and the "Head" of the farm was her son Henry.



They had the following children.

- F i. **Mary EADIE** was born on 28 Oct 1852 in Muckhart, Perthshire, Scotland. She was christened on 11 Nov 1852 in Muckhart, Perth, Scotland. She died before 1870 in Perthshire, Scotland.

Birth and Christening reference: C113852. This Mary appears to have died at an early age as another Mary is recorded for this family in 1870. See notes for "Mary Arkinson Eadie" -- #740.

- F ii. **Grace Scott EADIE** was born on 11 Jan 1854 in Muckhart, Perth, Scotland. She was christened on 14 Feb 1854 in Muckhart, Perth, Scotland. She died in 1857 in Muckhart, Perth, Scotland.

This Grace Scott Eadie (born 1864), died as a young child in 1857 explaining why she was not listed on the 1881 census taken at Casterton Farm. However, another "Grace Scott Eadie" WAS listed -- (born 1875, age 5). It would therefore appear that the second "Grace Scott", was a "replacement" daughter. This family obviously followed the traditional Scottish naming tradition because "Grace Scott" was the "mother's mother" and explains the importance (to them), of having this name retained in the family line.

- M iii. **Daniel EADIE** was born on 24 Nov 1855 in Muckhart, Perthshire, Scotland. He died in unknown date.

+ 9 F iv. **Margaret EADIE** was born on 14 Mar 1857. She died on 1 Jul 1905.

- M v. **Henry EADIE** was born on 19 Mar 1859 in Muckhart, Perthshire, Scotland. He died in unknown date.

I once asked my father why he chose "Henry" as my middle name. He told me that he had an uncle Henry he was fond of and that I was named after him. Since this is the only Henry in either the Waddell or Eadie lines who was his uncle, this must be the one. The 1901 census shows that Henry, age 41, took over the Eadie family farm ("Northfield Farm") at Dunipace.

- M vi. **John EADIE** was born on 23 May 1860 in Muckhart, Perthshire, Scotland. He died in unknown date. The 1901 census lists his occupation as a "House Joiner".
- M vii. **James Alexander EADIE** was born on 4 Jul 1863 in Muckhart, Perthshire, Scotland. He died in unknown date.
- F viii. **Jane EADIE** was born on 12 Jun 1865 in Muckhart, Perthshire, Scotland. She died in unknown date.

This family (Jane's parents) was for some reason listed twice in the 1881 census taken at "Casterton" farm. The information is an exact duplication except for Jane. In one copy she is listed as "Jane", (which has been used in these records), and in the other she is shown as "Jean".

- M ix. **Mary Arkinson EADIE** was born about 1870 in Bannockburn, Stirlingshire, Scotland. He died in unknown date.

The 1881 Census data taken at "Casterton Farm" lists her as "age 11" and as a "granddaughter" of John and Margaret Eadie -- and therefore NOT one of their children. She could have been the daughter of Mary, the oldest daughter then at home in 1881 or, a daughter of any of her four brothers who had possibly lost a wife in childbirth. The exact circumstances and identity of Mary's parents are therefore unknown at this time. However, noting that her second given name is "Arkinson", it is possible this was her mother's family name. (This entry may therefore need to be relocated if and when additional information is obtained.) FHL Film #0203544, Ref Volume 488-2, Dist 6, (pages 1 & 9 -- listed twice).

- F x. **Grace Scott EADIE** was born about 1875 in Bannockburn, Stirlingshire, Scotland. She died in unknown date.

It appears this Grace Scott may have been a 'replacement' daughter for an earlier sibling of the same name -- see notes for #663. It is noted however, that there was a 10-year gap between this Grace Scott, (born abt 1875), and the last other known birth in this family, (Jane born in 1865.) This time span raises the possibility that this Grace Scott may have been a granddaughter. (The other children listed for this family are recorded as born in Muckhart, while the 1891 census for North Field Farm, Dunipace, shows Grace as born in Bannockburn, Stirling.) The 1881 Census data is shown on FHL Film 0203544, Volume 488-2, District 6, Page 9.

20. **John HARDING** was born about 1832 in Thorpe Langton, Leicester, England. He died after 1901 in Leicester, England. John married Lucy NEAL on 6 Jul 1857 in Easton, Stamford, Northampton, England.

Family oral history had previously reported him as being a Shepherd in England and he is listed as such on his son John Thomas Harding's birth certificate as well as his marriage certificate, July 6, 1857, (Marriage98.jpg). Both the 1861 and 1871 census listings show him as a Shepherd. The 1881 British census lists him as an "agricultural labourer". FHL Film #1341744. By the time of the 1891 census at Thorpe Langton, only his youngest son George (age15) was still at home. The 1901 census lists his son George as a "Baker", and as the "Head" of the family although both John and Lucy are still listed.

21. **Lucy NEAL** was born on 29 Jul 1839 in Corley, Easton, Northampton, England. She died after 1901 in Leicester, England.

Birth registration reference "Birth99.jpg". She is listed on the 1851 census, age 11, with her father, mother and 5 siblings. On the 1861 census at Thorpe Langdon she is married to John and listed as a "shoe binder". The marriage registration reports her as the daughter of a railway policeman.

They had the following children.

- + 10 M i. **John Thomas HARDING** was born on 4 Oct 1858. He died in Nov 1943.
- F ii. **Ann Elizabeth HARDING** was born in Dec 1862 in Bingham, Leicester, England. She died about 1864 in Leicester, England.
- Ann apparently died as a young child, (1864 or earlier), as another Elizabeth Ann was born to this family in 1865.
- F iii. **Elizabeth HARDING** was born about 1863 in Thorpe Langton, Leicester, England. She died in unknown date.
- Elizabeth is shown on the 1901 census in business for herself as a "dressmaker", single, age 38, in the Chelsea area of London.
- M iv. **Edward HARDING** was born about 1864 in Thorpe Langton, Leicester, England. He died in unknown date.
- Family oral history reported that he immigrated to South Africa about the turn of the century. He has not been found on the 1891 census -- and there is an unnamed "Harding" on shipping lists to Capetown in 1892, age 27. (So while it has NOT been proven that this is our Edward, the family "oral history" just MIGHT be true).
- F v. **Ann Elizabeth "Annie" HARDING** was born about 1865 in Misterton, Thorpe Langton, Leicester, England. She died in unknown date.

It appears that this Ann was a "replacement" for another Ann in this family. The 1881 census records her living and working as a 'domestic servant' at a nearby residence in Leicester. FHL # 1341744.

- F vi. **Clara HARDING** was born about 1870 in Thorpe Langton, Leicester, England. She died in unknown date.

Clara is listed as a "house maid" at a retired magistrate's house in the 1891 census taken at "Stoke Albany House", Market Harborough.

- F vii. **Louisa HARDING** was born about 1873 in Thorpe Langton, Leicester, England. She died in unknown date. Louisa is listed unmarried, on the 1891 and 1901 census as a "kitchen maid".

- M viii. **George HARDING** was born about 1876 in Thorpe Langton, Leicester, England. He died in 1912 in Leicester, England.

Shown on the 1891 census at Thorpe Langton with his parents. (Last child still at home). George is listed as a "Baker" on the 1901 census with his parents at Thorpe Langton.

22. **Thomas PROSSER** was born in 1810 in Dilwyn, Hereford, England. He was christened on 4 Mar 1810 in Dilwyn, Hereford, England. He died after 1881 in Hereford, England. He was buried in England. Thomas married Isabella POWELL on 26 May 1835 in Garway, Hereford, England.

Family oral history originally reported him as "owning and operating a carriage manufacturing company." However, this appears to be incorrect as the 1881 census lists him as an "agricultural labourer", age 70, and a "widower". Marriage reference: LDS M138871

23. **Isabella POWELL** was born about 1815 in Garway, Hereford, England. She died before 1881 in Hereford, England. She was buried in England.

Isabella apparently died before the 1881 census as her husband is listed as a "Widower".

They had the following children.

- F i. **Sarah PROSSER** was born in Jan 1842 in Garway, Hereford, England. She was christened on 15 Jan 1842 in Garway, Hereford, England. She died in unknown date.

Christening reference: LDS C138871

- M ii. **John PROSSER** was born about 1849 in St Martins, Hereford, England. He died in unknown date in England.

The 1881 census lists his occupation as an "Innkeeper". FHL Film# 1341625. Marriage reference: LDS M155433

- M iii. **William PROSSER** was born about 1850 in Hentland, Hereford, England. He died in unknown date.

- + 11 F iv. **Catherine "Kate" PROSSER** was born on 2 Apr 1859. She died in 1936.

24. **(Unknown) CAMPBELL** was born in Bute, Scotland. He died in unknown date in Scotland. (Unknown) was in a non-marital relationship with Mary CAMPBELL.

The actual circumstances of his relationship to Mary, the mother of his child, will likely never be known as family secrecy has withheld all information about this man. Those that knew the truth have long since died without divulging any facts other than this person fathered an illegitimate son, (Alexander #44). *While it is unproven, the shroud of family secrecy and the circumstances surrounding the birth of Mary's child tend to indicate this man was most likely a close family member.*

The photo displayed is another version of a Campbell badge. The Latin "ne obliviscaris" translates to "do not forget". There is no information to support a connection to this branch of the line.



25. **Mary CAMPBELL** was born on 24 Sep 1843 in Rothesay, Bute, Scotland. She was christened on 19 May 1844 in Rothesay, Bute, Scotland. She died in unknown date in Scotland.

The previously unknown mother of Alexander (#44). Many of the circumstances surrounding her son Alexander's parentage, on both sides, still remain a secret as those family members who knew the complete truth have long since died. Alexander's Christening reference, LDS Film # C115588, lists only his mother's name, indicating an illegitimate birth, and this information was later confirmed on Alexander's Birth Extract. Alexander is known to have been raised by a Maclean family, but as a "Campbell", and this originally made it appear that his mother had been a Maclean. It's also a matter of record that Alexander later used "Maclean" as a second or third given name for some of his children. The combination of these circumstances therefore seemed to confirm "Maclean" as his mother's surname. However, it is now known that the Maclean surname connection came from the family of Alexander's maternal grandparent Catharine Maclean who raised him. (See #800).

The photo shown is reputed to be the historical Coat of Arms for Clan Campbell of Bute, (and certainly there are similarities to other Campbell Crests shown elsewhere in this journal). The Latin clan motto: "Ne obliviscaris", is reportedly translated into English as: "Do not forget". (With the known historical connection of this part of the family to Bute, it's possible there may be a family association with this Emblem but this has NOT been established).

+ 12 M i. **Alexander CAMPBELL** was born on 22 Sep 1862. He died on 12 Jun 1938.

26. **Donald KENNEDY** was born on 13 Jun 1828 in Islay, Argyll, Scotland. He was christened on 25 Jun 1828 in Islay, Argyll, Scotland. He died in unknown date in Scotland. He was buried in Scotland. Donald married Isabella MACINNES about 1853 in Islay, Argyll, Scotland.

He is listed on the 1861 census at Achourk farm with his wife and four children then born. Donald and Isabella had a family of 5 daughters and 4 sons. They lived at "Achourk" in one of the three or four croft houses that earlier was part of a small farm on a hill at the eastern end of Loch Ascog. Donald worked at the gunpowder mill at Millhouse and is listed as a "gunpowder maker" on the 1881 census taken at "Achourk Farm." This small village housed the work force for the powder works built in 1836 that supplied some of the munitions for the Crimean and the Boer wars. A dam on Loch Ascog at that time supplied the water power to operate the mill. Birth record LDS batch C100051.

27. **Isabella MACINNES** was born on 24 Mar 1825 in Tyree, Argyll, Scotland. She was christened on 6 Apr 1825 in Tyree, Argyll, Scotland. She died in unknown date in Scotland. She was buried in Scotland.

Christening Reference: LDS C115515.

They had the following children.

M i. **Angus KENNEDY** was born on 11 Aug 1855 in Glassary, Bruachleddich, Argyll, Scotland.

F ii. **Isabella KENNEDY** was born on 1 Apr 1857 in Kilfinan, Islay, Argyll, Scotland. She died in unknown date in Scotland. She was buried in Scotland.

F iii. **Mary KENNEDY** was born on 11 Feb 1859 in Kilfinan, Islay, Scotland.

+ 13 F iv. **Euphemia KENNEDY** was born on 27 Feb 1861. She died on 26 May 1932.

M v. **Donald KENNEDY** was born on 27 May 1865 in Kilfinan, Argyll, Scotland. He died in unknown date in Bruachleddich, Islay, Scotland. He was buried in Bruachleddich, Islay, Scotland.

Reportedly died at an "early age". Birth reference C115181

M vi. **John KENNEDY** was born on 2 Oct 1867 in Kilfinan, Islay, Scotland. He died in Aug 1946 in Scotland. He was buried in Aug 1946 in Gartna Grenach, Scotland.

F vii. **Margaret "Maggie" KENNEDY** was born on 16 Feb 1870 in Kilfinan, Argyll, Scotland. She died in unknown date in Scotland. She was buried in Scotland.

Birth reference: C 115181

M viii. **Alexander KENNEDY** was born on 31 Oct 1872 in Kilfinan, Argyll, Scotland. He died in unknown date.

Birth reference C: 115181

F ix. **Flora Ann KENNEDY** was born about 1876 in Kilfinan, Argyll, Scotland. She died in unknown date in Scotland. She was buried in Scotland.

28. **Murdo MACKENZIE** was born about 1835 in Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. He died in unknown date in Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. He was buried in Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. Murdo married Catherine (Kate) MCIVER on 16 Mar 1854 in Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland.

Nothing is known about Murdo. He was most likely a fisherman, (as that was the prevailing occupation in this remote seaside community at that time), although he is listed on the 1881 census simply as a "Crofter". In the same census, (FHL Film #0203409), his two sons still at home, Kenneth and Hector, are listed as "fishermen". It's also noted that while present day family members use a spelling of "MacKenzie", the census listing spells the name as "McKenzie" which, may or may not simply be the Registrar's error.

29. **Catherine (Kate) MCIVER** was born about 1834 in Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. She died in unknown date in Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. She was buried in Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland.

Currently a source entry for this part of the line.

- F v. **Catherine MACKENZIE** was born on 5 Nov 1862 in Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. She died in unknown date.
- F vi. **Annie MACKENZIE** was born on 22 May 1863 in Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. She died in unknown date.
- M vii. **Duncan MACKENZIE** was born on 17 Feb 1865 in Gairloch, Rosshire, Scotland. He died in unknown date.

census age of 71, it seems likely she had died sometime earlier. Alexander apparently died sometime after the 1841 census as he did not appear with other family members on the 1851 census taken at the same farm location. Originally, it was believed that Alexander's "Given" name was "Archibald", because that was the name shown in information listed on his son Archibald's (#215) death extraction. (A grandson Robert Waddell #659 was the "Informant" for this data and it appears, he either did not have much knowledge of his grandparents, or, he never checked the accuracy of the registration document, as in addition to listing the wrong given name for his grandfather, his grandmother was recorded as "Mary _____", without a maiden surname). It was later determined from his daughter Mary's birth reference, that Alexander's wife's maiden surname was Wilson. The only other information on the extract was that his grandfather had been a farmer and this agrees with the 1841 census. Birth Reference: LDS C116622. Marriage Reference: LDS M119662.

Only 5 children have been identified in Alexander's marriage to Mary. It is noted there is a large gap between John (born c1803) and James (born c1811). Similarly, there is a 7-year gap between Mary born c1812 and the last known birth of Alexander in 1819. It therefore seems almost certain that there are likely still more siblings to be identified in this family.

The photo shown is from a grave-marker in Dunblane cemetery depicting an Eadie family crest. (It is currently not known if there is a connection of this Eadie to our part of the line.) The source and historical accuracy of the crest are also unknown at this point, although one print of the crest carries a reference to the battle at Bannockburn in 1314. The Latin inscription reads: "Crux Mihi Grata Quies" and is said to translate into English as: "The cross gives me welcome rest." At this time, this should be considered as a piece of Eadie trivia as there is currently no proven connection to the family line.

The origins of Campbell as a surname are lost in time. However, excerpts taken from a "Scottish Family History", (circa 1989) covering Clan Campbell consider the name to have been "Pictish" in origin and to have been translated from the original Gaelic "Caim Beul", which in turn is said to mean "crooked mouth". One explanation for this is that one of the founding chieftains reportedly had a distinctive facial distortion. The crest stored with this file is a reproduction of one used by the Duke of Argyll, the historic Chieftain of Clan Campbell. There is no information available to establish a connection other than name with this branch of the Campbell line.

The photo shown is of a reputed Waddell "Coat of Arms". If genuine, then the identity of the Waddell rightfully entitled to lay claim to it has been lost in antiquity. The oldest written reference so far uncovered for anyone who MIGHT just be eligible, is for a Scottish knight, Sir Thomas Wedalle (note the spelling), who held a "writ of passage" to the Port of London in 1372. Whether or not he or one of his descendants is or was the legitimate claimant will perhaps never be determined. Certainly at this time, there is no known proof or data to tie Sir Thomas to either this part of the Waddell line or to this Coat of Arms. "Burks General Armory" lists three Waddell Coats of Arms, (two English and one Scottish), without giving any further information. This particular "Coat" if valid, could therefore belong to any of the three -- or none of them -- so that part of the mystery endures. The Latin Motto associated with this Coat is: "ORNA VERUM" and translates into English as: "ADORN THE TRUTH". (It somehow doesn't seem like a very inspiring motto considering today's concept of "adorning the truth").



"Black's Book of Scottish Surnames" considers the surname "Waddell" to have originated in Scotland. In support of this, the earliest Waddell references so far found in English and Irish surname directories are for dates much later than the earliest listings in "Black's". One report considers them to be descendents of the Vikings who landed in the Orkney Islands and Northern Scotland where they settled around 870 under their king, Stigurd the Stout. There are however, other reports based on Beryl Platt's heraldry research, which claim they originated from Flemish noblemen who settled first in Huntingdon/Bedford shire/Northamptonshire (and recorded in the Domesday records), and who then later moved up to Scotland. There is also an important but now believed extinct branch, that lived in the Livingston area of Midlothian for about 300 years - (the Waddell's of Holehouseburn, Crofthead and Stoneyburn) - who are buried in Whitburn churchyard.

So while many questions still remain about the physical (genetic) origin of the name, historians essentially consider the surname "Waddell" to be a 'locational' or 'place name' associated with Wedale in the Parish of Stow in the Southern Uplands. In the 1200's, the first known record identifying a bearer of the name, was for Adam de Wedale, reportedly a Norman who settled in Stow after first holding lands in England. In 1202 Adam was referred to as an "outlaw of the Kings of scots land", (no information found as to why he acquired this distinction). By 1296 however, the name appears to have gained acceptance and Lawrence de Wedale of Roxburghshire rendered homage to King Edward 1 of England. Simon Wedale was Abbot of Holyrood palace from 1296 to 1327, later becoming Bishop of Galloway in the west. The knighted Sir Thomas Waddell (Wedalle) was head of the household in 1372 and this part of the line continued to have vast interests in England through the 1600's. They branched south to Beach House, Walmer in Kent about this time. Another branch of the family were celebrated brewers at Liff for over 200 years. The Waddell name in variant spellings is also prominently recorded in numerous other references in England and Scotland throughout the 16th, 17th and 18th centuries.

The 17th century produced a major period of Scottish immigration as a result of a various social, political and economic conditions. A number of Waddell families re-settled in Ireland between 1700 and 1800, establishing the name there, while other branches are known to have immigrated to North America in the same time frame. A family headed by a James Waddell settled in Maine in 1745 and another James Waddell family went to New Brunswick around 1820. Other Waddell branches arrived in Ontario and Nova Scotia about the same time. A William Waddell settled in San Francisco in 1852, and later partnered with Russell and Majors to form the famed "Pony Express" in 1860. Other famous Waddell's include baseball's "Hall of Famer", George Edward 'Rube' Waddell. During the Revolutionary war against the British, there were Waddells who fought on both sides. After the war, some families retaining British loyalties now immigrated to Canada, mainly to Ontario and where if they registered as "United Empire Loyalists", they became eligible for land grants or other resettlement assistance. In the later war between the North and the South in the USA, there were again Waddells on both sides, although predominately with the Confederate forces. Among them was James Iredale Waddell from North Carolina, a graduate of the naval academy at Annapolis who later resigned his commission with the Federal forces to join the Confederate navy where he became a well-known Captain and "Privateer" -- (some say pirate) -- who was revered in the South and reviled in the North.

By the time of the 1911 Canadian census, the latest publicly released, there were over 700 Waddell's listed across the country.

Some Surname Directories consider "Harding" to be one of the variants of an earlier Norman surname reportedly brought to England in the time of William the Conqueror. There also seems to be general agreement that it is a "patronymic", (or a father's name), with the "ing" suffix added and used to denote "son of". Some references promote an original English spelling of "Hard" (or "Harding" with the suffix), and sometimes spelled with or without an "e" added. This spelling was then apparently pronounced and written out, as "Hard" or "Harding(e)".

There is also much contradictory opinion as to the actual "meaning" of Harding as a surname. Some accounts interpret it literally to mean a stern or severe individual. Others claim it relates to farming and specifically as to "he who dwelled, (farmed on), the hard ground" and when the suffix "ing", for "son of", was added, it became Harding. Other interpretations consider Harding to mean "firm or loyal", as in a staunch friendship or a trustworthy individual. There is also an opinion that the name relates to deafness as in those who were "hard" of hearing. Any (or none) of these "opinions" could apply, as surnames are known to have evolved in many different ways due to the local economic, social and political conditions prevalent at or about the time in the 1100's when formal surnames first came into general use. Later written records (and obviously the education and writing skills of the recorder), then further influenced the spelling of what had previously been only a verbal surname. It is therefore easy to see how "Harding" (and of course many other surnames), were later mis-interpreted and recorded in a number of different spellings. In the process, this effectively produced additional surnames (sometimes in the same family), and often making it difficult to accurately track any family line.

When the prefix of "Mac" (for "son of") was later added, it became the Anglicized surname known today as MacKenzie. Exact dates are not known for when the MacKenzie surname came into general use. However, it was certainly well established by 1263 when the MacKenzie clan is recorded as helping to drive the Norsemen from Scotland at the battle of Largs.
